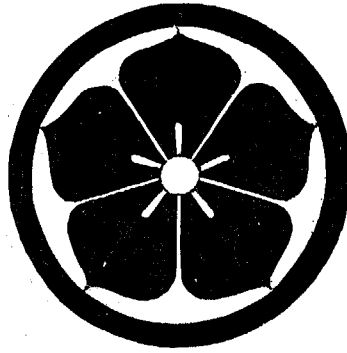

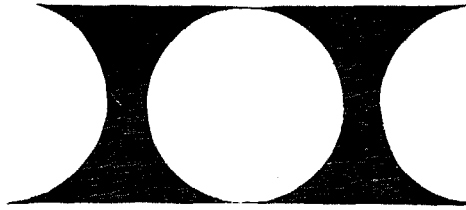

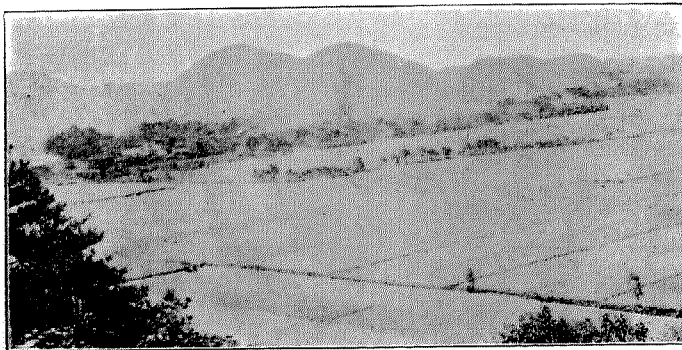

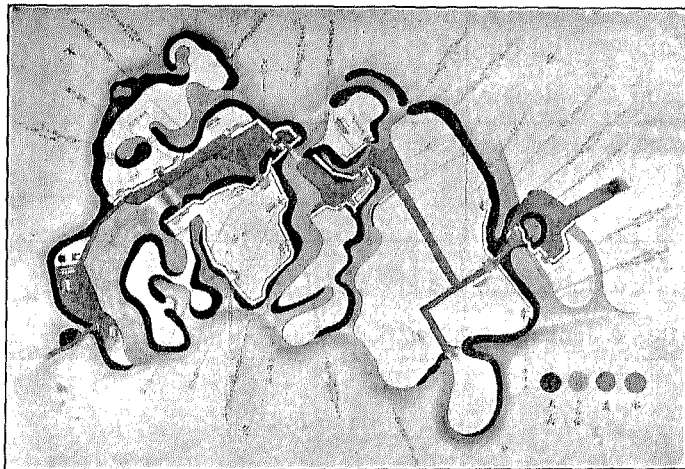

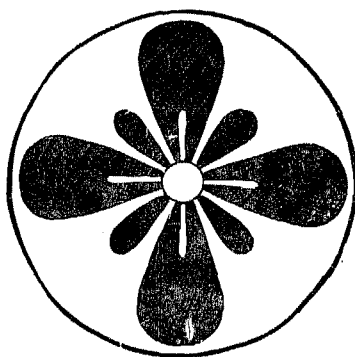

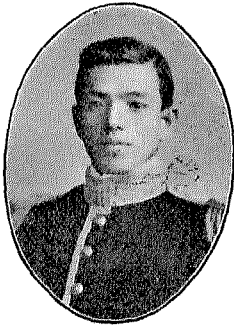
SITE OF THE CASTLE AT NIHOMMATSU.

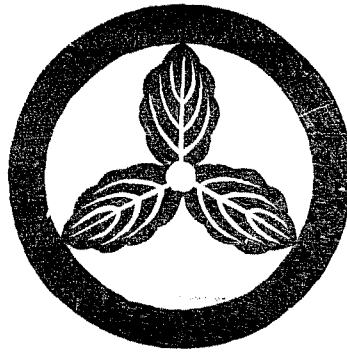

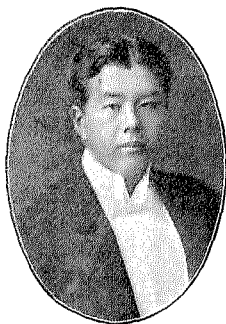
SITE OF THE CASTLE AT KUWANA.

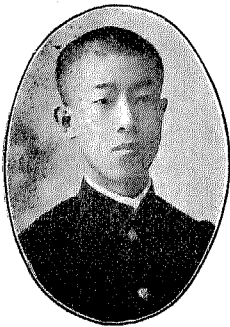
CASTLE HILL AT ASHIMORI.

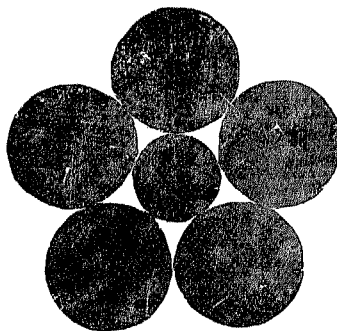

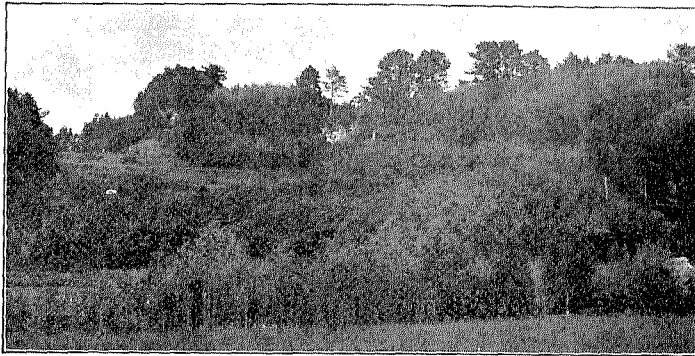

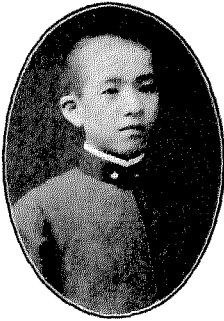
SITE OF THE CASTLE AT SANUKI.
