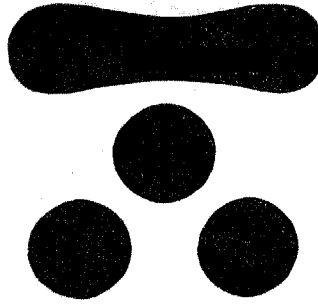


SITE OF THE CASTLE AT SHIDZUKU.

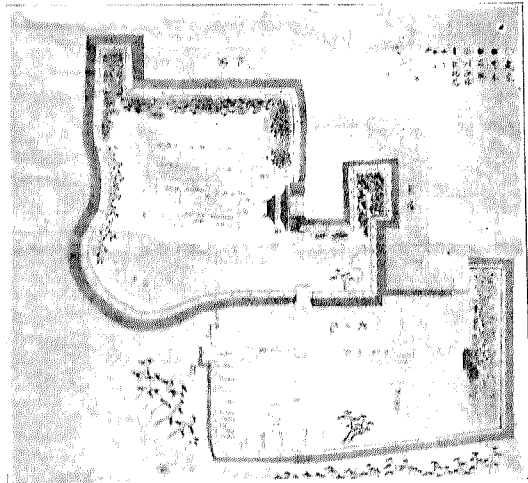
